A local family stopped at the cemetery later in the day to place memorial flowers and remarked how nice the grounds were. We can be proud of how well cared for our cemetery looks as we start the summer.

The Cemetery Committee is off to a great start, and I would like to thank, Tina Lindballe, Jennifer Hodel, Teresa Caesar, Linda Myshaniuk, Derrick Saskiw and Councilors Morris Anderson and Aaron Cannan for stepping forward to serve on the committee.

At the April inaugural meeting we elected a Chair, Sheila Whitmore, a Vice-Chair, Derrick Saskiw, and decided that the Recording Secretary duties would be handled on a rotational basis. Because all the financial records and related responsibilities are handled through the Village Office by CAO Jennifer Hodel, we did not need to elect a Treasurer. Thank you to Jennifer for adding the cemetery finance responsibilities to those she currently handles for the village.

The Cemetery Committee met again May 28. We would like to remind everyone that the meetings are open to the public and more members are welcome. We meet the last Wednesday of each month, 7:00 pm at the Village Office, but as we get more organized and up-to-date with our projects, the committee will meet only three or four times a year
