INNISFREE CEMETERY ASSOCIATION

The Innisfree Municipal Cemetery is a non-denominational cemetery serving our community and rural residents. For many years our community had an active cemetery association, but like many other small communities, sustaining the association became difficult, and the task of cemetery management fell to a few dedicated individuals. Early in 2013, our Village Council determined the need for a new cemetery association to ensure the safe storage of records, update and verify the accuracy of records, develop relevant bylaws that revisit the outdated fee and operational structures, and oversee a series of necessary improvements to the cemetery.

A group of willing and able community members have been recruited to serve as board members of the Innisfree Municipal Cemetery Association (IMCA): **Dwayne Sangster, Derrick Saskiw, Tina Lindballe, Terry Caesar, Linda Myshaniuk**, a Village Council representative to be named, and a project manager in an advisory capacity, **Sheila Whitmore**. Board members will serve for a term of two years.

The board would like to extend an invitation to any interested resident of our community or surrounding rural area to join the association.

When cemetery bylaws have been developed and adopted by Village Council, they will be posted in an issue of the Innisfree Informer. A set of board initiatives and responsibilities will be posted as well.

The condition of our municipal cemetery reflects our love and respect for those who helped to build our community in years past. While there are sufficient funds in the current cemetery account to allow for paid summer maintenance, the IMCA has decided to host the **First Annual Innisfree Municipal Cemetery Maintenance Day, Saturday, May 31, 1:00 pm - 4:00**. Please come to the cemetery prepared to help with lawn mowing, raking, pruning and sweeping and bring the necessary tools and equipment if you have them. Please come prepared to participate safely, bring gloves, safety glasses, and wear closed toe shoes or work boots. IMCC board members will be on hand to help, and to take your suggestions and discuss the work we hope to accomplish as an association board.

Information on Canada Post's New tiered stamp pricing

With rapidly declining Lettermail volumes and more addresses to serve every year, Canada Post is introducing a new pricing structure for letters. Stamp prices will increase to better reflect the cost of serving different customer segments. New commercial rates will be introduced with discounts for customers that use the mail most.

PER STAMP

Booklets and coils

The price (per stamp) will be \$0.85, up from \$0.63 today for letters 0-30 g mailed within Canada.



\$1
PER STAMP

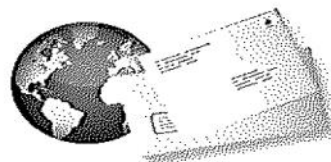
Single stamps

Single stamps will cost \$1 each for letters 0-30 g, up from \$0.63 today. Canada Post estimates that only 2 per cent of all stamps are purchased as singles.



Meters

Businesses that use postage meters will pay a new discounted postal commercial rate of \$0.75 (per letter 0-30 g).



Other products

U.S., international and oversized Lettermail and mail over 30 g will also increase, and will typically fall in line with the new established pricing levels.

Prices for parcels and for addressed and unaddressed advertising mail are not affected.

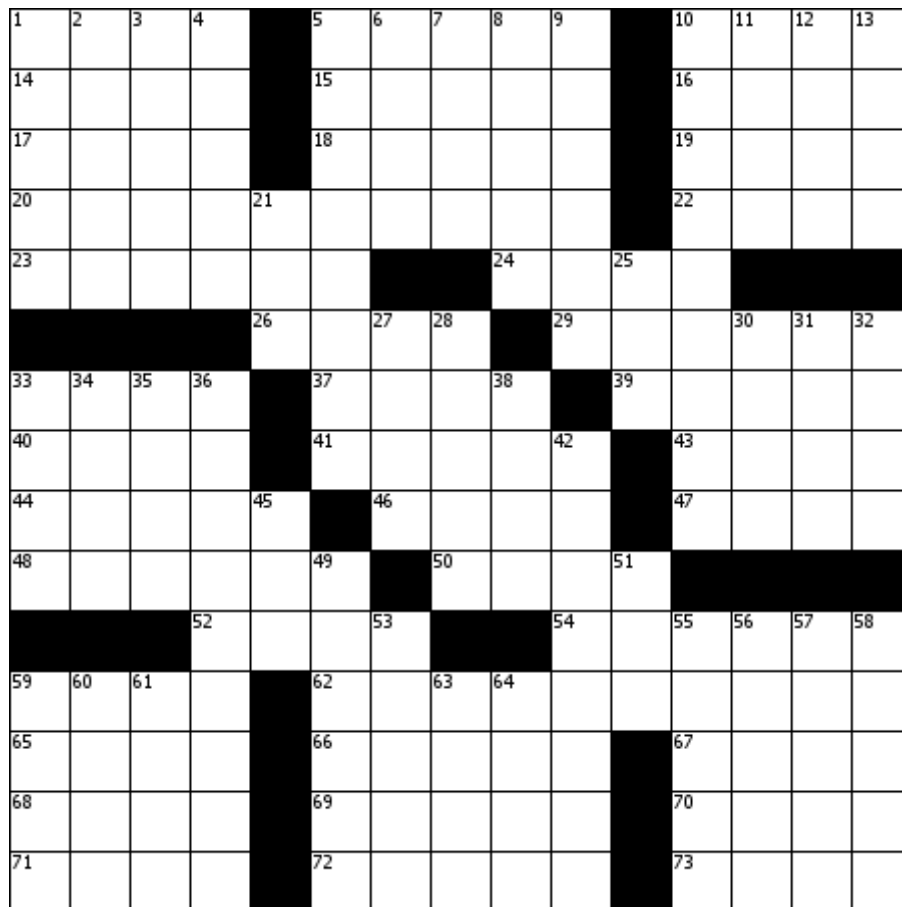
