





PROVIDENCE GRAIN SOLUTIONS COMMUNITY OUTREACH INCENTIVE PROGRAM

Providence Grain Solutions in conjunction with CWB is launching a community initiative program to do our part to ensure that the children in our communities can go to school every day without hunger preventing their ability to learn, promoting a healthy body and a healthy mind.

Providence Grain Solutions supports farmer's choices as to how they market their grain, and starting **October 1st, 2013**, for every tonne of grain that farmers choose to market through CWB and deliver to a Providence Grain Solutions handling facility, \$1 will be donated to the Drive for Sixty Five Healthy Lunch Initiative.

CWB has pledged to match our donation dollar for dollar, so for every tonne of CWB contracted grain delivered to a Providence facility, \$2 per metric tonne (\$1 from Providence Grain Solutions and \$1 from CWB) will be donated to support of a Healthy Lunch Program to the school of choice as determined by the delivering farmer.

This program has been co-ordinated with the Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) that represents the school of choice in order to ensure funding gets applied to the school/community as elected by the delivering farmer.

Innisfree Delnorte School PAC has pre-registered with Providence Grain Solutions in order to become an eligible participant and would appreciate area farmers taking the time when they deliver their CWB contracted grain to a Providence Grain Solutions facility, to indicate that they would like a donation to be made to Innisfree Delnorte School under the Drive for Sixty Five Healthy Lunch Initiative.

Donations will be paid quarterly with the first contributions going out approximately the first week of January 2014.

It is time when we as a faith community must make some decisions on the future of the Innisfree United Church.

The questions we have to ask ourselves are:

- Is there a need for a United Church faith community in our area?
- 2. If the answer is yes, are we willing to support the church on an on-going basis financially and with time and talent?
- If the need is not there, we have a church building and property that must be disposed of and what that means is someone has to take this task on. The money from the sale of the building cannot be used for operational expenses of the pastoral charge.

At present we do not worship in the Church building. However there is still a cost to maintain the church at approximately \$ 2400.00 per year.

We belong to the Mannville Vermilion Pastoral Charge and our commitment per month is \$750.00. The small group that we now have worshipping is not able to maintain this commitment.

Since September of 2011 we have had two worship services a month and had a faithful small group support this and so we believe that a need is there for worshipping together.

So it is urgent that we make a decision as to what the future of the Innisfree United Church will be. Please attend a meeting on November 19, 2013 at 7:00 PM in the Meeting Room in the Millennium Building to give your input. A final decision will be made.






