New Viking Veterinarian



The Viking Veterinary Clinic has a new addition to its clinic staff.

Dr. Lacey Fowler has recently joined the team of veterinarians and support staff at the clinic which treats small and large animals.

Dr. Fowler, daughter of Vern and Lorraine Fowler comes from the Innisfree area where her family still operates a mixed cattle farming operation. The oldest child of three, Fowler says she has always played an active roll in the cattle farm but has always had a special interest in horses.

During her high school years Fowler spent some time

performing work experience at the Viking Veterinary clinic learning the day-to-day operations of the clinic.

After graduating from Innisfree-Delnorte School in June 2005, Fowler enrolled in the pre-veterinary program at the University of Alberta Augustana Cam-pus in Camrose, Alberta. In the fall on 2008 Dr. Fowler attended the Western College of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Saskatchewan in Saska-toon until her convocation in April of 2012.

She says although she enjoys all animals, she has a keen interest in horses and cattle.

Dr. Fowler attended a practicum as part of her studies for one month in Weatherford, Texas at an equine clinic where she honed her skills.

Upon her return to Canada she applied for a position at the Forestburg Veterinarian clinic in June of 2012 and was offered the position. She worked at the clinic until December at which time she applied for a Veterinarian position at the Viking Veterinarian clinic. The closer-tohome clinic offered Dr. Fowler the opportunity to continue her services closer to her roots.

Dr. Fowler works four days a week at the Viking Veterinary clinic and helps out at two other affiliate clinics in the area where she says she is learning helpful tricks of the trade.

Dr. Fowler said she is looking forward to the upcoming calving season and is very thankful to Dr. Deborah Carroll clinic owner, and Dr. Pru Maxwell for their guidance and support.

Fowler is currently commuting from her family farm near Innisfree but is considering moving closer to her employment in Viking. However, it must offer accommodations for her horse.
