
#### <u>Innisfree-Minburn 4H Beef Club</u> <u>by Megan Rudolf</u>



On April 15, 2013, many Innisfree and area residents took part in a Wear Yellow Day in support of Renaye Wade, a young lady from Mundare who was injured in a car accident on March 15 in Edmonton.

Renaye suffered a broken pelvis, jaw and a sever brain on April 18, she was declared no longer in a comatose state but still has a long road of recovery ahead of her.

Renaye younger brother Adam, used the tools of social media and created a Facebook page called Wear Yellow Day, being Renaye's

For those who are unaware, Renaye is the girlfriend of Jackson Bird of Innisfree.

March 15 will forever be a day that is etched in our minds. Nobody ever wants to hear the news of a loved one who has been injured in an accident. She is an important part of our lives.

By the show of support from our community we have been able to get through this difficult time.

As of April 23, Renaye has undergone surgery to repair her jaw and is now breathing on her own. She is alert for a good part of the day but is still struggling to communicate with us. She recognizes her parents, Jackson and some friends.

She recently has undergone a procedure which has enabled her to say the words "okay" and "Bye", a huge accomplishment for her.

We know there is a long road to Renaye's recovery but through the support of Innisfree's Wear Yellow Day and thoughts and prayers from friends and family, we know she will make a wonderful recovery.

# Kids' sports drinks: SCIENCE OR SCAM?

T'S TOUGH TO ESCAPE THEIR MARKETING. YOU MIGHT even find posters extolling the virtues of chocolate milk as a "refuelling" or "recharging" drink for your kids on the walls of their elementary or middle schools.

But do your kids really need to "refuel"?
Certainly, if it's a sweltering day and they're playing actively, hydration is going to be a concern. Children sweat less than adults and have a greater skin area in relation to body mass. Consequently, in hot environments they heat up faster than their parents and they also retain more heat. It's also true that kids may not voluntarily drink enough fluids during sport or play, and studies on drinks spiked with sugar demonstrate that, kids being kids, they tend to drink more of the sugary stuff.

#### BUT HOW MUCH SUGAR ARE WE TALKING BOUT?

rake those so entitlilities contain ers of "recovery" chocolate milk. Each one has 20% more calories and double the sugar of a Snickers bar (up to an astonishing 15 teaspoons' worth), and I'm fairly certain most parents wouldn't consider refuelling their little athletes with a stretched, double-sugared chocolate bar.

And how about the more toxically coloured blue, red and yellow energy drinks? Well sugar-wise they're certainly

a tad lighter than chocolate milk, but those ubiquitous 500-millilitre bottles still contain 7.5 teaspoons each of the sweet stuff.

#### SO WHAT'S A PARENT TO DO?

1 Pre-hydrate If you know your children are slated for some prolonged physical activity, make sure they drink plenty of fluids before they get out on the field. Water will do just fine.

2 Keep them hydrated For activities lasting less than an hour, you needn't worry about kids losing electrolytes such as sodium and potassium. Two-thirds of a cup of ice-cold water every 20 minutes of activity for kids weighing less than 90 pounds — and a full cup for kids weighing more than that—will easily cover their fluid needs.

3 Refuel them According the American Academy of Pediatrics, lifethreatening electrolyte imbalances are rare in children performing for fewer than four hours, but if your kids are truly going to be active for prolonged periods of time and electrolytes are a concern, don't buy into the sugary hype of the chocolate milk marketers.

Instead, opt for snacks lower in sugar (to do your own teaspoons calculation, simply divide the number of grams of sugar listed on the label by four). Or stick with water and keep up their electrolytes during the game with sodium-containing snacks such as nutrition bars.

4 Make them play smart Dress your

4 Make them play smart Dress your children in light-coloured clothing that allows for efficient evaporation of sweat (that helps keep them cool). That means staying away from 100% cotton. If it's extremely hot, consider calling off the game or, at the very least, enforce frequent breaks, ensure regular rotation of players and have plenty of ice-cold water on hand.

As far as "refuelling" goes — aside from rehydration — there's nothing in those beverages to make your children better athletes, and buying into the advertising only puts money into their parent companies' overstuffed pockets.
