

# Farm Wife Diaries... Comfort VS Concern by Deb Barber

In my tiny world of isolation I have discovered that things that once were taken for granted have started to become items of concern; first it was the toilet paper scare, then shelves were emptied of flour and brown sugar and now orange juice is the newest article we can no longer go without.

The toilet paper was never an issue with us as we purchase several months supply when it is on sale at Costco and that has been our practise for years not something caused by the news of a pandemic. At first I was worried when I was unable to locate flour as I was baking our own bread and goodies to sustain Farmer Hubby but, I researched how I could grind wheat to make our own flour and as soon as I had that figured out the odd bag started to appear on the shelves. I was looking for some brown sugar, but I've been able to manage with what I have on hand and the orange juice as much as I enjoy it, it's not a necessity.

And while most of the world shares my concerns listed above, Farmer Hubby has his own set of concerns and no, they have nothing to do with farming. On a regular basis he has me 'count' the remaining jars of homemade jam/jelly and relish in the cold storage room as his greatest fear is that it may run out before the next harvest of fruit and vegetables comes to fruition. I have caught him eating jelly by spoon right out of the jar and some nights I'm sure if I skipped the potatoes and just piled the relish on his plate, he wouldn't even miss them!! I have assured him there is sufficient fruit frozen in the deep freezer for a few more batches of jam; the relish however maybe something that he will have to restrict his consumption of if supplies should diminish to that extent.

We had a lovely traditional Easter ham supper on Easter Sunday but last night saw us turning towards more traditional comfort fare. We found ourselves once again at "Deb's Diner", a place we have been frequenting daily. Sometimes the service is not exceptionally speedy at this establishment, in fact there are times I could even put a load of clothes into the washing machine while waiting for our meal. It has a 'one item' menu and for last nights meal it was hamburger served with french fries. I will give bonus points that the burgers were hand made including a homemade bun, relish and even the dill pickle garnish. The fries were even cooked in a healthy manner in an Actifry, addressing all our culinary needs with healthy choices.

However, I discovered they have a 'wash your own dishes' policy so I deducted an additional two stars as who wants to eat out at an establishment that has you clean up and do your own dishes? If our options weren't so limited, I might choose to dine out at a different location!


