

July 2020 Village of Innisfree Council Meeting Highlights

Mayor and Council met on July 21, 2020 for their Regular Council meeting to discuss important items such as Tax Recovery Auction – 2020, Demolition of Old Public Works Facility, Installation of a Barrier Free Ramp, Culvert Installation as well as other important topics that will be mentioned below.

Mayor, Council and Administration set the date for the 2020 Tax Recovery Auction to November 25, 2020 at 5:00 PM. The location of the Tax Recovery Auction will take place in the Village Council Chambers located at the Village of Innisfree Administration Office (5116 – 50 Avenue). Please keep an eye out for advertisements in the Alberta Gazette, Village of Innisfree Social Media Pages as well as the Vegreville Advertiser.

Administration brought forward quotes for the demolition of the old public works building located at 5207 – 50 Avenue and the installation of a Barrier Free Ramp at the Administration Building. After much discussion, Council accepted Road Runner Water Hauling Ltd. Quote for the demolition of the Public Works Building. Start date for the demolition is to be determined. Regarding the Barrier Free Ramp, Council directed Administration to readvertise the Barrier Free Ramp project in the local newspaper(s), Social media, and Innisfree Informer in hopes to receive additional quotes for this project.

Bar Engineering brought forward a few additional options for the Mayor, Council and Administration to discuss regarding the 50 Street Flood Mitigation. After reviewing the 3 proposed options, submitted by Bar Engineering, Council decided to proceed with the installation of two (2) 300 mm diameter culverts across 50th street and one (1) culvert crossing East Street. Start date for this project is to be determined.

Council members reviewed a letter, sent by the City of Cold Lake, regarding the recent Amendments to the Criminal code approved under the "Order in Council" on May 1, 2020. Council passed a motion to direct Administration to send a letter to the Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness regarding the concerns related to these amendments. Council also felt that the letter should state that the Village of Innisfree supports the initiative to end violence, however feels very strongly that the Government of Canada is wasting valuable resources and taking the wrong approach to gun control that will have zero effect on gun crime.

Other equally important topics discussed were: the replacement of Fire Hydrant on the corner of 49 Avenue and 51 Street, culvert replacement along the south side of 49 Avenue, a letter dated July 20, 2020 regarding the Innisfree Campground, Overdue Accounts Receivable, Fire Department and Village Staff Wage Increases.

The meeting was then adjourned.




at these projects. I tend to stay a good distance away so that I am unable to decipher what colorful choice of language may or may not be coming out of his mouth!
