December 2020 Village of Innisfree Regular Council Meeting Highlights

Mayor and Council met on December 15, 2020 for their Regular Council meeting via Electronic Means. Council discussed numerous items, which included: Delegations:

Mayor and Council were presented a delegation at the December 15, 2020 Regular Council meeting. The delegation was by Mr. Grant Bergman, and presented a written request regarding 2021 Minimum Tax. Mayor and Council received this delegation as information.

New Business:

• Buffalo Trail Public School – Request for Handicap Parking/Loading Zone on Highway 870: After reviewing Alberta Transportation's response to Buffalo Trail Public School's Letter of October 9, 2020, Council passed a motion to receive this item as information. However, Council directed Administration to send a letter to Buffalo Trail Public School and the Parent Advisory Council, regarding Alberta Transportation's response and recommendation(s).

• 2021 Interim Budget(s) & Budget Forecasts: Administration brought forward the 2021 Interim Budget & Budget Forecasts, which included: 2021 Interim Budget & 2022-2025 Budget Forecast, 2021 Interim Capital Budget, 2021 Interim Five Year Capital Plan; and the Interim 10-30 Year Infrastructure/Capital Plan. After Carefully reviewing each document, Council passed a motion to approve the 2021 Interim Budget(s) as amended.

• Other items discussed: 2021 Go East of Edmonton Advertising Renewal, ItsPromo Quote dated September 17, 2020 – Vehicle Decals (Public Works Truck/Equipment), Radio 106.5 – Christmas Packages, FCM 2021 Membership Renewal, MD of Minburn Foundation 2021 Requisition Letter and Calculations, 2021 Proposed Utility Rates as well as Councillor Reports, Administration Reports & financials and all items listed under correspondence.

Don Mazankowski came to Innisfree with Andy Kopas from Viking and ran the garage. Later they sold the garage to Albert Dobler.

From Innisfree, Don and his brother Ray ran a garage in Vegreville. Walter Kravetz bought a Minneapolis Moline tractor from them. Albert Melnyk and Don Mazankowski delivered it to Innisfree. Mary invited the men in for coffee and all they could talk about was politics. At that time, this area was looking for someone to run for the Federal Liberal and Conservative parties. Walter suggested to Don he should run. Don said, "Who me?"

This may have the seed to get Don to throw his hat into the ring. Mary and Walter, Mavis and Borden went to the Conservative Party meeting to choose the candidate for the next election. The voting went on into the wee hours. There were three candidates, and it took three rounds of voting to declare Don Mazankowski the Conservative candidate for the next Federal Election. Mary and Mavis were both very tired the next day as they had to go to work. That began Don's climb to become the deputy prime minister of Canada and he also served as minister of many other departments.

Mary said, "Don always found time for everybody."

I also spoke with Nadia Melnyk about her memories of Don. Albert worked for Don and Ray Mazankowski at the garage in Vegreville for many years. When Wanda was born in 1966, Don came to Albert and asked him to be a foreman in the garage for the next 4 years as he would be away in Ottawa. And after that they had a good friendship. When Albert passed away, Don called Nadia and expressed his condolences and remarked for him it was like losing a brother. Nadia respected Don and felt he was a great man.

I was glad to hear about the Innisfree side of the story of Don Mazankowski's life and wished to share it with you.

SPINACH SALAD (Serves: 6)

Dressing Ingredients: 2 tbsp Honey

- 1 tbsp Dijon mustard
- ¹/₄ tsp Sea salt
- ¼ tsp Black pepper
- 3 tbsp Lemon juice
- 1/4 cup Olive oil (or Canola oil)

Salad Ingredients:

- 6 heaping cups Baby spinach (washed)
- 1 cup Fresh blueberries
- 1 heaping cup Thinly sliced English cucumber
- 1/3 cup chopped toasted hazelnuts
- (or sub w/ toasted slivered almonds)
- 1 Ripe avocado, sliced
- 3 Hard-cooked eggs, peeled and sliced

HOW TO MAKE PERFECT HARD-BOILED EGGS EVERY TIME

1. Place the eggs in a large saucepan and cover them with cold water by about 1 inch. Slowly bring the water to a boil over medium heat.

2. As the water begins to simmer, gently stir the eggs to centre the yolks. When it reaches a rolling boil, cover the pot and remove from heat. Let it sit for 10 minutes (for creamy yolks), or 15 minutes (for firm yolks).

3. Drain the hot water and fill the pot with cold water to stop the cooking. Let the eggs sit in the cold water for 2 to 4 minutes before peeling and serving.

Whisk together honey, mustard, salt and pepper in

ding-dong, not dong-ding; King Kong, not Kong King? Turns out it is one of the un-written rules of English that native speakers know without knowing.

The rule, explains a BBC article, is: "If there are three words then the order has to go I, A, O. If there are two words then the first is I and the second is either A or O. Mish-mash, chit-chat, dilly-dally, shilly-shally, tip top, hip-hop, flip-flop, tic tac, sing song, ding dong, King Kong, ping pong."

There's another unwritten rule at work in the name Little Red Riding Hood, says the article.

"Adjectives in English absolutely have to be in this order: opinion-size-ageshape-color-origin-material-purpose-noun. So you can have a lovely little old rectangular green French sliver whittling knife. But if you mess with that word order in the slightest, you'll sound like a maniac."

This rule even has a technical name, if you care to know it-the rule of ablaut reduplicationbut then life is simpler knowing that we know the rule without knowing it.

Farm Wife Diaries ... On The Tenth Day of Christmas ... by Deb Barber



On the Tenth Day of Christmas my true love gave to me, "Ten Lords a Leaping".

Possibly the best gift ever! Imagine the size of home you would require to house the twelve drummers, eleven pipers, ten lords, nine ladies and eight maids and unless they are all a core member of your family you probably could expect the COVID-19 police to come pulling up to your house lights a blazing and sirens screaming!

You would also probably require all twenty-three birds named in the song producing eggs to serve for breakfast as well as being busy turning some of that milk into butter and cheese to go with the eggs!

I won't even begin to explore the number of pigs required to provide the bacon nor the coffee plantation for their morning cuppa inspiration.

Ten Lords a Leaping makes me think of physical activity and then its not a huge leap to thinking about snow shovelling, one of the major physical activities we engage in during the winter to keep up our physical fitness.

Farmer Hubby and I divide up the snow-covered area so that we can share equally in the work required to keep the house and yard in good condition to traverse.
