#### Innisfree Mayor's Message in a Minute


I am pleased to see that most of the residents of Innisfree have been busy in their yards. The rain has given us new hope to see everything flourish.

#### SLOW DOWN WHEN PASSING OUR SCHOOL

Per Alberta.ca: When you approach a school or playground sign, with a maximum speed posted with it, you are entering a school and/or playground zone. You must not exceed the posted speed when the zone is in effect. The speed limit for both urban and rural school zones and playground zones is 30 km/h unless other-wise-posted.

**km/h** While school zone limits are in effect on school days only, the **entire stretch of road past the Delnorte School is also a playground zone.** Playground speed restrictions are in effect EVERY DAY from 8:30 am to 1 hour after sunset.

#### May 2021 Village of Innisfree **Regular Council Meeting Highlights**

Mayor and Council met on May 18, 2021 for their Regular Council meeting via in-person.

The Council Agenda package (with attachments – excluding closed session items) can be found at: www.innisfree.ca Council discussed numerous items, which included:

#### **Business Arising:**

• Motion 2021-03-26/02 - Village of Innisfree Solar Energy Project: Administration prepared a Request for Decision for the Solar Energy Project. After much discussion, Council passed a motion to receive this item as information.

#### **Bylaws & Policies:**

• 666-21 - Tax Payment, Penalties, Etc.: Administration brought forward a revised Tax Payment and Penalties Bylaw for Council to review and consider. After reviewing the proposed Bylaw, Council passed a resolution to receive the Bylaw as information.

#### New Business:

#### • Ministerial Order MSL:095/18 – Viability Review

Mayor and Council reviewed the revised Action List/Timeline prepared by Administration in response to the Viability Review Ministerial Order MSL:095/18. After reviewing the draft document, Council passed a motion to approve as amended. Mayor and Council also directed Administration to send a letter, on or before June 1, 2021, to ensure compliance with the above-mentioned ministerial order.

#### • 2021 Capital Budgets

Administration prepared a Draft 2021 Capital Budget, Draft 5 Year Capital Plan and a Draft 10-30 Year Infrastructure Plan for Council to review and consider. After reviewing the draft documents, Council passed a motion to approve the draft documents as amended.

#### • ACE Water Capital Contribution

Administration brought forward the ACE Water Capital Contribution for Council's review and consideration. After reviewing the options outlined in the Request for Decision, Council passed a motion to direct Administration to apply for MSI Capital Grant funding to be used towards the 2021 ACE Water Capital Contribution. Further, should the MSI Capital Grant application not be approved, that the funds be transferred from General Administration Capital Reserves.

Council passed a motion to approve the purchase of the Hammer Drill/Hex Driver Set, at a cost of \$471.45 (GST Included), as outlined in Quote dated May 10, 2021 from Jard Industrial Supply Ltd.

#### SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT APPEAL BOARD REQUEST FOR MEMBERS OF PUBLIC AT LARGE

The Village of Innisfree requires two (2) members of public at large for the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board. This quasi-judicial body, appointed by Council, makes impartial and unbiased decisions on challenges of subdivision or development authority decisions and stop work orders. Deliberations are based on the municipal planning documents such as the Land Use Bylaw and Municipal Development Plans, provincial statute and information presented by hearing participants.

Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearings are scheduled as required. Board members are appointed for a one (1) year term with an option to be reappointed for a second term.

Village residents with an interest or experience in planning or development activities are invited to submit a resume including a statement on your interest and abilities in serving in this capacity.

Mandatory training is required upon appointment. Cost of training will be covered by the Municipality (if applicable).

Compensation will be offered to the appointed members of public at large who attend the scheduled Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearings as required.

We are sorry to hear of the passing of William Kosterewa. He was active in volunteering in the museum and held the position of Vice-President. He will be missed by our historical society.





## Thank You Global Warming... by Deb Barber

Back in March when I was just itching to start some flower seeds. I never dreamed that at the end of May I would still be hauling the pots in and out of the house because the nights would be dropping to zero or below! I'm not complaining it's very good exercise; by the time I haul them out I've accumulated 1,500 steps and another 1,500 to tuck them away at night and voila I have 3,000 of my 10,000-step goal already taken care of!

Sometimes on the windy days I try to tuck them close to the house for protection, but they still often end up with the wind-swept look, I think they have decided they would prefer to be simply 'house' plants. Fortunately, Farmer Hubby has decided he likes having flowering pots scattered all over our dining area and has even offered on many days to assist me with the task of taking them in and out.

Thinking 2021 would be a standard weather year, yes, I know what was I thinking that anything would be normal ever again! I purchased some beautiful tomato plants from the local 4H fund raiser and a few nicely filled pots from the Mannville Grad Fundraiser. Between the house and overflowing greenhouse there simply was no room left at the Inn, so the overflow has been placed my black garden cart and I haul them in and out of the barn on a daily basis, so they remain somewhat conditioned for life in the wild.

Seeding went along with really not many hitches, especially since that's no longer our concern!! Farmer Hubby got the spraying done, just barely as the Raven Tech spent more hours in our yard than the sprayer spent in the field. I jokingly told Farmer Hubby we could have

hired the job out for less than it cost us to do it ourselves. The tech had tried to guide me over my iPhone several times and during one of those long-winded conversations I either missed the instructions to return the machine back to its original settings or perhaps in all the confusion he forgot to instruct me. However, imagine my frustration when we had pressure when we opened the spraying booms, but once the 'master' switch was engaged the pressure quit. Fortunately, the Tech was at the neighbours and dropped over to the field, he took him only seconds to determine the issue and once the Raven was instructed to spray when the tractor was moving all was well. Well, not quite, the auto boom feature wasn't working, and the parts were on back order from China, apparently doing the back stroke to get here! That meant manually operating the booms, which honestly on a flat field is so easy one wonders why they even need this advanced technology. But head into a field that's all-rolling hills and suddenly it takes two people to operate the sprayer, one on wing detail and the other to operate it! Hopefully, it's fixed before the next round of spraying begins!

Fortunately, Farmer Hubby can operate the rock picker solo as the tractor that pulls it is pretty tiny and sitting on the hard console gets old amazingly fast. The great thing about the old tractor and rock picker is that there are no computers nvolved so Farmer Hubby is as content as a pig in the mud

as it is a world he is most comfortable with.

Our trees are all awfully slow in unfurling their leaves and sadly the Nanking cherries were in full bloom when the thermometer dipped to minus nine one night and I'm sadly thinking they will not bare any fruit. The wild Saskatoon bushes are in full bloom, but my tame ones sure look sad. I see after that life saving rain over the weekend that the apple trees look slightly better but only time will tell what they may or may not produce.

The only genuinely happy plants are the raspberries and rhubarb, it takes a lot to deter either one of them so I'm happy to have such hardy survivors in the garden.

Unlike most years my garden is not in the ground but still in the packages, does that make me feel behind, yes it does. It was so dry that I didn't want to seed it and then when the rain was forecast, I decided to wait as last year the garden was washed out twice and this year's game plan is to just seed it once!
