

Mayor and Council were presented three (3) delegations at the April 20, 2021 Regular Council meeting. The second delegation was by Carolyn Best, from ATCO Electric, also presented information regarding the Village of Innisfree's Solar Panel Project. 



NO BAKE CHEESECAKE

Graham Cracker Crust:

2 cups graham cracker crumbs 1/3 cup packed light or dark brown sugar 1/2 cup unsalted butter, melted

Cheesecake:

1 and 1/4 cups heavy cream or heavy whipping cream Three 8-ounce blocks full-fat cream cheese, softened to room temp

- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 2 Tbsp confectioners' sugar
- 1/4 cup sour cream, at room temp
- 2 tsp lemon juice
- 1 tsp pure vanilla extract

Directions:

CRUST:

Stir the graham cracker crust ingredients together. Pour into a 9 or 10" springform pan and pack in very tightly. The tighter it's packed, the less likely it will fall apart when cutting the cheesecake. Freeze for 10-20 minutes as you prepare the filling.

FILLING:

- 1. Using a hand mixer or a stand mixer fitted with a whisk attachment, whip the cold heavy cream into stiff peaks on medium-high speed, about 4-5 minutes. Set aside.
- 2. In a separate bowl, beat the cream cheese and granulated sugar together on medium speed until perfectly smooth and creamy. Scrape down the sides and up the bottom of the bowl with a rubber spatula as needed. Add the confectioners' sugar, sour cream, lemon juice, and vanilla extract. Beat for 2-3 minutes on mediumhigh speed until smooth and combined. Make sure there are no large lumps of cream cheese. If there are lumps, keep beating until smooth.
- 3. Using your mixer on low speed or a rubber spatula, fold the whipped cream into the cheesecake filling until combined. This takes several turns of your rubber spatula. Combine slowly as you don't want to deflate all the air in the whipped cream.
- 4. Remove crust from the freezer and spread filling into crust. Use a spatula to smooth down the top.
- 5. Cover tightly with plastic wrap or aluminum foil and refrigerate for at least 6-8 hours and up to 2 days. For best results, 12 hours is best. The longer refrigerated, the nicer the no-bake cheesecake will set up.
- 6. Use a knife to loosen the chilled cheesecake from the rim of the springform pan, then remove the rim. Using a clean sharp knife, cut into slices for serving.
- 7. Serve cheesecake with desired toppings (canned cherries, fresh preserves, chocolate fudge, whatever you like!)

A few days of axe pick work and chains pulling out stubborn root systems and the area is almost ready to start the process to cultivate and level the ground for the seeding of new grass (like we need any more of that to mow!)

Soon I saw Farmer Hubby eyeing up some of the old pine trees that his father must have planted close to 75 years ago.

They have grown all twisted and knotty and now have turned a sickly hue of yellow with their needles browning off and starting to shed and so the decision was made to take

them out as well.

When they stand there looking so majestic and reaching to the sky, they do look like they go on forever, but once you take them down you can genuinely appreciate how tall they had grown to be. I always find it interesting to look at the growth rings on the stumps, I could see that there had been many years of

ideal conditions allowing the trees to grow larger and hearty, but the last few inches from the outer bark were so dark and tiny that it confirmed that they have been struggling to remain alive for some time.

Thankfully, Mother Nature has a solution, and the circle of life continues to provide as there are many small evergreen trees already struggling to grow in the shade of these older trees that will now benefit from the space and sunlight.

While Farmer Hubby was working his magic with the chain saw and in between helping him load up branches and trunks to haul away with the pickup I found myself looking at the tangled mess that the lilac bushes had become. I have no idea when they were planted but I suspect they probably are all of 50 years old as well. For the last few years, they too have not prospered with fewer and fewer bunches of flowers and looking frail and sickly. Googling how to rejuvenate old lilacs I found that the information on my iPhone recommended that they be cut back to 6-8 inches above ground and allowed to regrow. I grabbed my pruning shears and tried to attack the mess. A moment or two later Farmer Hubby stepped in with his chain saw and 'had at it'. We have been left with an interesting mess as some of the wood appears to have been dead for years and of course the very young and slender saplings bent and twisted in the chain of the saw. It is apparent that I will need to go in with the pruners and do some clean up! I have NO idea if anything will survive the slaughter but worse case scenario, we will have to remove the bottom 8 inches left behind.

It is interesting to see how the removal of some trees and bushes has opened up

and changed the entire look of the yard. I find it difficult to implement change as I have such an attachment to the history of the original homesite. However, change is inevitable and is not necessarily a bad thing.

A neighbour had been sharing with us that they had invested a number of years ago in a leaf/grass vacuum and how helpful they found it for spring clean up. Farmer Hubby had inquired if I thought I would like something like this as the 'raking' of the lawns has become a huge chore that I no longer undertake with the enthusiasm of youth! I thought the idea held good merit and so he set out to locate one. It arrived just before the snow all melted and we both were anxious to give it a try. I have to say it has been a great addition to our equipment arsenal and works so well that after operating it for about 1 hour I discovered Farmer Hubby 'took' over the chore and I haven't operated it since. Not only does the yard look fresh and the grass greening up nicely, the finely chopped leaves were put onto the cultivation around the raspberries and once worked in have added a good amount of organic matter to soil that had the consistency of cement and now is fluffy and light.
