> Coming together is a Beginning. Keeping together is Progress. Working together is Success.


As said by Henry Ford, I hope that as we Begin, and Progress we will have Success.

#### **PLEASE!** SLOW DOWN WHEN PASSING OUR SCHOOL

Per Alberta.ca: When you approach a school or playground sign, with a maximum speed posted with it, you are entering a school and/or playground zone. You must not exceed the posted speed when the zone is in effect. The speed limit for both urban and rural school zones and playground zones is 30 km/h unless otherwise posted.

While school zone limits are in effect on school days only, the **entire stretch of road past the Delnorte School is also a playground zone.** Playground speed restrictions are in effect EVERY DAY from 8:30 am to 1 hour after sunset.

No representation was made, either it written or verbal format, regarding the proposed Method's of Advertising Bylaw 667-21. *The meeting was then adjourned*.

#### August 17, 2021, Village of Innisfree Regular Council Meeting Highlights

Mayor and Council met on August 17, 2021, for their Regular Council meeting.

After reviewing the information provided, Mayor and Council directed Administration to research and develop a Smoking Bylaw, outlining the amendments to the Tobacco and

Date of the Public Auction Tax Sale has been set for November 25, 2021 at 5:00 PM at the Village of Innisfree Administration Office (5116 50 Avenue, Innisfree AB).





# Three Sheets to the Wind! by Deb Barber



I got home later last night from an appointment and while checking my messages I overheard Farmer Hubby grumbling

a bit about temperatures and immediately my ears perked up. He was going on about 'frost warnings' and it being far to early for such nonsense and I quickly flipped to the Weather network app. Sure enough, it was claiming that although the overnight low was 5 degrees Celsius it would feel more like +2! Alarmed that if the cucumber plants even caught a hint of this lower temperature, I knew they would immediately curl into a ball and proceed to perish; so armed with flashlights I headed out to cover as many plants as possible

First, I headed to the greenhouse to move in the most productive cherry tomato plants and to shut the vents and door to minimize the heat loss. From there I headed over to the sea can where I store the old sheets inside. I fumbled with the latch and then made my way via the tiny circle of light luminated by my flashlight to the shelf where the blankets are stored. By this time Farmer Hubby had caught up to me so I loaded his arms with sheets and sent him in the direction of the cucumber patch. Last year I had decided to sew a number of sheets together so that I have access to large enough sheets to accommodate greater areas to cover the plants more efficiently and I have found this has made covering the plants so much easier.


After covering the cucumbers, I decided I had sufficient blankets left to cover the majority of the Tiny Tim pumpkin plants as well. This meant a second trip into the dark interior of the sea can and by now my rubber boots were several sizes larger with the accumulation of mud. That inch of rain that had made us so happy had brought with it that clingy, mucky soil that clumps onto the soles of one's boots. Farmer Hubby is 'very' fussy about the interior of his sea can, so I had to slip the rubbers off while walking into secure more blankets. In the end I don't think the temperatures dropped sufficiently, however, I'm happy to take that time to ensure I don't lose the fruits of my gardening efforts before I absolutely have to!

This morning when I was removing the sheets from the plants, they were barely even damp which is so unusual as most times in the fall they are drenched with dew. Nonetheless I hung them over the wooden fence so that they could completely dry in the wind that has them all billowed out like ship's sails.

A week or so ago we though that harvest had hit full tilt with neighbours racing up and down the road with sprayers, swathers, combines and trucks. 
