September 21, 2021, Village of Innisfree Regular Council Meeting Highlights

Mayor and Council met on September 21, 2021, for their final Regular Council meeting of this Electoral Term. The Council Agenda can be found at: <u>www.innisfree.ca</u> Council discussed numerous items, which included:

Policies/Bylaws:

• **Strategic Framework Policy 1100-07** – Council approved the Policy with revisions to add new supporting documents: the Strategic Plan & the Municipal Development Plan.

New Business:

• October Council Meeting Date – Council rescheduled the October Organizational and Regular council meetings to Tuesday, October 26 at 5 pm.

• **Smoking Bylaw** – Council rescinded a previous motion directing Administration to draft a Smoking Bylaw.

• **2022 ATCO Franchise Fees** – Council maintained the existing ATCO Electric FF at 5% and the Natural Gas FF at 25% of Distribution Revenues.

• **NWSA** – Council approved the 2022 Municipal contribution to the North Saskatchewan Watershed Alliance at \$0.50 per capita.

• National Day of Truth & Reconciliation – Council acknowledged September 30th as the National Day of Truth & Reconciliation. Further, that the Village Office and Public Works Department will remain open.

• **Deputy Director of Emergency Management** – Council endorsed the appointment of Mr. Dean Lindballe.

• Asphalt Rehabilitation Project – Council approved a quote from Spectre Systems quote for three asphalt rehabilitation areas, to be funded by Federal Gas Tax Fund Grant and the 2021 Operating Budget.

The meeting was then adjourned.



SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT APPEAL BOARD REQUEST FOR MEMBERS OF PUBLIC AT LARGE

The Village of Innisfree requires two (2) members of public at large for the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board. This quasi-judicial body, appointed by Council, makes impartial and unbiased decisions on challenges of subdivision or development authority decisions and stop work orders. Deliberations are based on the municipal planning documents such as the Land Use Bylaw and Municipal Development Plans, provincial statute and information presented by hearing participants.

Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearings are scheduled as required. Board members are appointed for a one (1) year term with an option to be reappointed for a second term.

Village residents with an interest or experience in planning or development activities are invited to submit a resume including a statement on your interest and abilities in serving in this capacity.

Mandatory training is required upon appointment. Cost of training will be covered by the Municipality (if applicable).

Compensation will be offered to the appointed members of public at large who attend the scheduled Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearings as required.

Innisfree 4H Multi-Club


To parents, members and interested persons of the Innisfree 4-H Multi Club.





Similar to the question what came first the chicken or the egg, but with some sleuthing I was able to confirm that Au-

tumn was first and Fall came along about 300 years later!

Apparently some scholars felt that the seasons of summer and winter were not adequate in many regions to describe the seasonal changes and decided to adopt two additional time frames which were referred to as spring and harvest. However, sometime in the 1300's when reviewing the choice of labelling it was determined that the usage of the word harvest; "meaning a time to reap", excluded city "folk" so a more politically correct term had to be decided upon. It sounds like it wasn't a unanimous forum that chose the Latin word autumnus which was shortened to autumn but it was temporarily used to indicate the time after summer and before winter.

Sometime about 300 years later it was decided that Fall was a more accurate adjective to use and would fit in well with the term Spring. Spring indicating 'the springing of the leaf from the tree' and Fall then for the 'falling of the leaf from the tree'. Both words were descriptive of what occurred during the time frame they were labelling!

For whatever reason, perhaps to keep all parties happy, Fall and Autumn became inter dispersed and neither one is more correct to use than the other. So you are free to use either and to even mix them up just to keep everyone on their toes! I find the study of history so fascinating, especially when a personal twist is included or when I have the opportunity to chat with the people who 'made' the

history. I think our school system would be so enhanced if the people behind the history could actually come to the classroom to tell their stories. Dates and facts can be so dry but when you throw in that personal description of how things 'really' went down history comes alive.

In early September my cousin recommended the book, "The Forgotten Home Child" by Genevieve Graham. It is about the British children that were sent to Canada between 1869 and 1932. The number that came is somewhat disputed some sources say around 100,000 children were sent other sources report the number in excess of 120,000. The group was made up of orphans, children charged with minor crimes and some were sent by their families in hopes of giving them a better life. It was a difficult time in Great Britain and the country was plagued by unemployment and poverty.

A man named Dr. Barnardo set up a 'home' in Britain that took in these children, many rescued from the workhouses or from living on the streets. At this 'home' they were taught basic school subjects as well as Trades for the boys and cooking, cleaning etc. for the girls. The thought being to give them skills that would help them improve their lives.

These children were then brought by ship to Canada where most were placed in homes across rural locations; I read that families paid \$3 for them. Some children were fortunate and were taken in by good families with the intent of adopting them and giving them a safe and secure home. Others became indentured slaves and found themselves in a living nightmare where they ended up being free labour housed in the barn with the animals and eating scraps of food. There were not sufficient workers to ensure that the children's welfare was monitored and many suffered from malnutrition and abuse.

Sam's grandmother Lily Bushell (she later married Samuel Platt) was one of the Barnardo Home Children, fortunately she ended up in a home where she was kindly treated. She arrived in Canada on May 10th, 1903 at the age of 9 or 10 and was accompanied by her younger sister, Rose.

The survivors of this program mostly felt like they were 'lesser' or 'worthless' and many never shared their stories even with their own children or grandchildren. They were the 'lost' or the 'secret' children from Britain and it was something not to be spoken about.

I would like to think though that the people who sent them here whether they were orphans or sent by their parents truly believed they were coming to a better environment. As a grandmother and mother I can only imagine the heartbreak I would have felt putting my child on a ship, all alone, sending them into the unknown and praying that they would be the better for it.

I was surprised to learn about these children who grew up to be pioneers and an integral part of our Canadian history. I would challenge you to google the topic and do some research of your own as it is important we remember our history as that's what has brought us to where we are today.
