Council Meeting Highlights - November 16, 2021

- Council approved the Village of Innisfree's 2022 membership to the Go-East of Edmonton Destination Marketing Organization.
- Council approved the development of a revised Traffic Bylaw for the implementation of a Specified School Zone Time from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm during School days and a Playground Zone along Secondary Highway 870 on the two-block area and directed Administration to bring the Bylaw forward to the December Council meeting. Further, Council directed Administration to complete a Government of Alberta application for the installation of a Driver Feedback Sign, south of the School zone on Secondary Highway 870 in Innisfree.
- Council rescheduled the December Council Meeting to Tuesday, December 14th at 5:00 PM.

INNISFREE TRANSFER SITE

The Innisfree Transfer Site is closed to Public Access pursuant to Alberta Environment regulations. Authorized Access will only be granted with the Public Works Foreman in attendance. Hours are Monday through Friday, 9:00 am to 5:00 pm (closed over noon.) Please contact the Village Office during these times. All garbage must be bagged. No metal or household appliances or furniture permitted; residents may haul these types of items to the Mannville or the Ranfurly transfer sites. Please see the County of Minburn website to confirm dates and times for access to those facilities: (https://www.minburncounty.ab.ca/p/waste-transfer-stations)

SNOW REMOVAL POLICY/STANDARDS

The Village of Innisfree Council approved **Policy 3200-01 – Snow Removal Policy** – Roadways to provide direction to standardize the priority and procedure for snowplowing in Innisfree. The policy states the Village will commence snow removal on municipal roads if there are three (3) inches of snow accumulation. Priorities for heavy snowfall have been set including the Fire Hall (EMS), school bus drop off and pick up area, Main Street and so forth. (Policy 3200-01 is available to view in its entirety on the village website: www.innisfree.ca)

Snow Clearance Agreement - Release of Liability - The Village offers residents the opportunity to contract the Village for snow removal purposes within their personal property. The Property Owner must sign a Release in order to access this service. Snow Removal Policy Priorities will apply before the scheduling of snow removal on private properties. The Village Master Rates Bylaw provides the rental rate for the snow removal service and is available on the Village website.

SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT APPEAL BOARD REQUEST FOR MEMBERS OF PUBLIC AT LARGE

The Village of Innisfree requires two (2) members of public at large for the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board. This quasi-judicial body, appointed by Council, makes impartial and unbiased decisions on challenges of subdivision or development authority decisions and stop work orders. Deliberations are based on the municipal planning documents such as the Land Use Bylaw and Municipal Development Plans, provincial statute and information presented by hearing participants.

Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearings are scheduled as required. Board members are appointed for a one (1) year term with an option to be reappointed for a second term.

Village residents with an interest or experience in planning or development activities are invited to submit a resume including a statement on your interest and abilities in serving in this capacity.

Mandatory training is required upon appointment. Cost of training will be covered by the Municipality (if applicable).

Compensation will be offered to the appointed members of public at large who attend the scheduled Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearings as required.


From beginners to adults, we have all been busy getting back into the swing of things. New barre exercises, corner work and choreography are being learned, and we are having fun doing it!




