In order to vote in the upcoming municipal elections, voters will be required to provide proof of their name and home address. The following types of verification meet the standard provincial requirement for one piece of identification.

- •Identification issued by a Canadian government, whether federal, provincial, or local, or an agency of that government, that contains a photograph of the elector and their name and current address;
- ·Bank or credit card statement or personal cheque;
- Residential lease or mortgage statement;
- •Utility bill (for example, telephone, public utilities commission, television, hydro, gas or water);
- ·Government cheque or cheque stub; or
- •Income or property tax assessment notice.

SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT APPEAL BOARD REQUEST FOR MEMBERS OF PUBLIC AT LARGE

The Village of Innisfree requires two (2) members of public at large for the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board. This quasi-judicial body, appointed by Council, makes impartial and unbiased decisions on challenges of subdivision or development authority decisions and stop work orders. Deliberations are based on the municipal planning documents such as the Land Use Bylaw and Municipal Development Plans, provincial statute and information presented by hearing participants.

Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearings are scheduled as required. Board members are appointed for a one (1) year term with an option to be reappointed for a second term.

Village residents with an interest or experience in planning or development activities are invited to submit a resume including a statement on your interest and abilities in serving in this capacity.

Mandatory training is required upon appointment. Cost of training will be covered by the Municipality (if applicable).

Compensation will be offered to the appointed members of public at large who attend the scheduled Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearings as required.

On February 7, we will be voting again to fill our vacant council seat. I want to thank you for your support, calls, and questions. I would like to again let you know that I support our Village remaining independent of the County of Min-

burn, I support our school, and our resident's right to independence that we all enjoy in Innisfree. If elected, I understand that I work for my fellow residents. I find it concerning that I was once again the only member of the community seeking election to attend the Village Council Meeting on January 18. None of my 5 competitors have attended any of the 4 meetings since this council and mayor took office. I have attended all meetings other than the special meeting on December 30, of which I had no prior knowledge of, or I would have attended this meeting also. The December 30 meeting had Council sell our fire hall to the Country of Minburn for \$1.00 as part of the regionalization of our fire service. The regionalization for the fire service is wonderful, but there were options presented where the Village could have retained ownership of the fire hall and its assets. I spoke in favor of exploring these other options on December 14thand was told by Mayor Johnston that she was informed after the meeting that all questions and comments are to be summitted in writing before the meeting when I asked to speak on January 14.

Because the other candidates have not attended any of the past meetings, they also don't know that currently Village Administration is working to push unnecessary changes to the Traffic Control Bylaw. This new proposed 32-page bylaw (The Town of Vegreville has a 22 page bylaw) will make it a finable offence for our farmers living in the Village to park their farm trucks in front of their homes. I disagree with this as our community's foundation and heritage is agriculture. This bylaw will require the Hall Board to seek permission from the Village CAO if renters plan to stay in the Holiday trailers at the Hall or Rink for events. This is on property not owned by the Village, but by the Ag Society. Are we comfortable with the Village having this authority? I am not. I have other issues with this bylaw and encourage community members to read the proposed bylaw that was passed through its first reading at the January meeting. To provide background, Mayor and Council granted

permission at the November meeting to review the Traffic Control bylaw. This came after School Council asked for an application to be sent to the province for Driver Feedback signs (speed indication signs) and crosswalk signs to be installed on Hwy 870. This request was made in order to encourage travelers to slow down in front of the School and Library to keep our residents and children safe. These signs being requested would likely be paid for by the province, not the Village and all of the leg work was complete by members of School Council. School Council did not request a bylaw review. Since then, countless administrative hours must have been put into this project – all funded by our tax dollars.

As I informed you in my introductory letter last month, I understand business and asset management. It is important that our Mayor and Council give clear direction to Village staff and ensure that projects and tasks bring value to the residents of the Village of Innisfree. I have life experience that make me the correct choice on the ballot. If elected, I commit to abolish the said requirement that questions, and comments be submitted to Mayor and Council before meetings. I think it's important that we remember that we are a community and that we give all community members a voice. We are a small, but vibrant-community, and only with the correct council will we remain sustainable. I ask that you give me your support on February 7.

NOTICE TO ALL OCCUPANTS Snow Removal on Sidewalks Bylaw 593-13


Pursuant to Snow Removal Bylaw 593-13, property owners or occupiers are responsible for the removal of snow and ice on sidewalks (adjacent to the property.)


A property owner or occupant must NOT allow the snow/ice to accumulate to the degree that pedestrian or vehicular traffic would be inconvenienced or impeded.

Property Owners/Occupiers are responsible for all adjacent sidewalks. Examples are shown below:

Chocolate Square

Hamburger Soup

Ingredients:

- 1 lb Ground Beef
- 1 Onion, chopped
- 1 28 oz can tomatoes*
- 2 cups water*
- 1 can tomato soup*
- Sprinkle of parsley
- 4 carrots, chopped
- 3 stalks celery, chopped
- 8 tbsp pearl barley
- ½ tsp thyme
- 1 bay leaf
- 3 cans consommé soup or 2 beef bouillon cubes in 2 cups hot water (or use your own beef stock) Salt and pepper to taste

*Note: Canned tomatoes/water and tomato soup can be substituted with approx 5 to 6 cups of your own tomato sauce

Directions:

- -Brown meat and onions. Drain well.
- -Combine all ingredients in a large pot. Cook at least 2 hours or use crock pot and cook 8 hours. Freezes well.
- -This recipe can be made Gluten Free by using rice in place of Barley.


