Multi-Sport Court Project

Did you know that the community of Innisfree has tennis courts? They are located behind the skating arena on school property. They were constructed in 1998 by the Innisfree Fish and Game Association for the entire community to use.

Over the years they have become run down and are currently in need of repair. The Innisfree School Council has requested that Buffalo Trail School Division assist in the revitalization and maintenance of this area and have proposed that it become a multi-sport court with one half designated for basketball and street hockey and the other half for three pickleball courts. Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in North America. It is a low impact, less stressful game than tennis, played on a smaller court which appeals to people of all ages.

At the request of our school trustee Kara Jackson and school Principal Rachel Miller, Buffalo Trail School Division has given approval to this project and has agreed to commit funds. To date, School Council has obtained financial support from the County of Minburn as well as the Innisfree and District Ag Society. School Council has also applied for community facility enhancement grants to assist with the project.

This project will provide a unique outdoor recreation opportunity for not only our school students but for people of all ages in our community. Stay tuned for further updates and ways that you can become involved in this project.





Oranges, drained


1 ripe Avocado, peeled and sliced




