Mayor and Council met on May 17th, 2022, for a Regular Council meeting.

#### Policies/Bylaws:

• Council approved final Reading to Traffic Bylaw 670-22.



The Village will have the plots prepared for initial planting and there will be access to fresh water. Community Garden Handbooks with all guidelines will be available.



Once you have reviewed the guidelines and submitted your application it will be reviewed and if accepted, you will be notified of your plot location.

COVID-19 Precautions for Participants:

All participating gardeners will be required to comply with Alberta Health Services (AHS) public health orders for isolation if you are symptomatic, have travelled, or have tested positive for Covid-19, as well as follow current AHS guidelines for physical distancing. These public health orders apply to all public areas, including community gardens.



The Innisfree Delnorte School Sustainability committee was very pleased with the support you showed by attending the presentation from the Prairie Principal, Mr. Kevin Van Lagen from Altario and Consort Schools. It was encouraging to hear how a change in learning supported by the community took a struggling school facing closure and has helped it flourish and the community grow in a few short years. This is what the sustainability committee is looking to do by partnering with Parents, Teachers, Community groups, BTPS, and the Village of Innisfree. Altario has become a school focused on project-based learning largely with an agricultural focus. This doesn't need to be what Innisfree does but could be.

In March, we surveyed the parents of current students and in April the students themselves. While agriculture studies did interest some parents and students', other areas were of more interest. The sustainability committee has determined that the first area to pursue is Carpentry and Woodworking as identified by parents and students. We have plans coming together for this in the fall. Other areas of studies could include, culinary arts, computer programming and coding and robotics. While surveying parents we also asked about some of the positive and negative items in our school. Triple grading was discussed in several responses and is viewed as a negative thing. The Prairie Principal spoke about how triple grades are a positive thing in Altario and if given the choice he would triple grade his school in Consort. He feels that it allows the teachers the opportunity to teach to the student where the student is at rather than to a grade level determined by age not level of comprehension.

We, along with our Principal, plan to meet with the Board of BPTS in June and discuss what this new model may look like. We hope to get their support and start in September. The sustainability committee was developed to take a proactive look at how to ensure our school remains a vibrant part of our community for many years to come. There are some rumors in the community we would like to address.

1. BPTS has not indicated a closure of Innisfree Delnorte School now or in the near future. This committee was formed by parents and community members with children in the school or on the way to school.

2. The sustainability committee currently plans to take nothing away from core classes.

3. The sustainability committee has no plan to turn our school into an Agriculture Intense school like Altario has. We feel they are in a different area, with a different land base and landscape. Our students and parents have not indicated Agricultural studies as part of their top 5 wishes.

We as a committee see a bright and vibrant future for students in Innisfree, however want to ensure opportunity for our students in Innisfree rather than have them decide to leave Innisfree and attend school elsewhere.

## Thank you from Councillor Evan Raycraft

Hello Fellow Residents of Innisfree, I wanted to thank all those who supported me and voted me onto council. I have the privilege of serving on several different boards including Parent Council, Innisfree School Sustainability Committee, Joint Landfill and the Museum board. I wanted to provide an update of some items Council has been working on over the past few months.

1. Budget and Tax Mill Rate, the budget is set for the upcoming year and we expect to operate with a small surplus. Expect your tax assessment to arrive in June, council was able to reduce the Tax Mill Rate on your upcoming tax assessments. Minimum Tax will remain for properties with low assessed value but if your homes assessed value remained unchanged you will see a decrease in your property taxes.

2. I am excited to welcome a new business to our community and council approved a surveillance suit for the new owners to help facilitate this business entering the downtown.

3. Council has approved a paired down version of the originally presented Traffic Control Bylaw. Changes are minimal however you will see some updated signage coming soon including a driver feed-back sign south of the school.

4. Council has approved the sale of 5 properties by auction on July 26th at 5:00pm more information is available in the Village office. The village also has other vacant lots and property for sale. Please inquire with Brooke, our CEO.

I hope to see you at the Annual Public Meeting on June 22nd from 6:00-8:00 at the Museum. Council plans to BBQ for you and I look forward to hearing concerns from our citizens. Administration is also planning festivities for Canada Day. Please follow the Village Facebook page or watch for posters with more information.

# **NOTICE TO RESIDENTS**

#### MAINTENANCE OF GRASS/TREES & UNSIGHTLY PROPERTIES

Pursuant to Unsightly Bylaw 597-15, please keep in mind this summer that you are responsible for:

- The care of your property, back alley, boulevard, and the sidewalks around it,
- Cutting your grass and keeping weeds under control,
- Trimming your trees and making sure they do not hang over onto the sidewalk or back alley,
- All grass and tree trimmings must be bagged and set out with garbage to be picked up on Tuesday's.

Also, pursuant to Traffic Control Bylaw 670-22:

- No Person shall occupy, or suffer, or permit any other Person to occupy a Trailer, Holiday Trailer upon a Highway or Village-owned Property which has not been designated for Trailer or Holiday Trailer Parking unless for a special occasion and then no longer than 48 hours or a longer time is granted.
- An Owner or Operator of a Vehicle and attached Trailer or Holiday Trailer shall not park the Vehicle and attached Trailer or Holiday Trailer on a Highway or Roadway for more than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours.

#### CANINE & FELINE CONTROL

The Village of Innisfree Administration would like to remind the public of the Canine Bylaw 601-15 & Feline Bylaw 607/15. Canine Bylaw 601-15 & Feline Bylaw 607/15 clearly states that no owner shall allow their Dog(s) or cat(s) to run at large, at any time, without being leashed or harnessed while off the premises of its owner.

The Village of Innisfree would like to share, with its residents, simple steps to humanely deter unwanted **cats** from their yards and flower beds:

- Some plants and herbs naturally deter cats by giving off smells that cats dislike, including Rue, Lavender, Pennyroyal, Lemongrass, Coleus and Citronella.
- There are numerous types of cat repellent sprays and granules, which can be purchased at many hardware stores.
- Water is an effective repellent. Gently spraying or splashing water on a cat is a useful method for keeping them away.
- Remove any food sources that may be attracting cats into your yard. Ensure garbage / compost bins are securely shut.
- Bury chicken wire in the soil in the flower beds that you especially don't want cats to enter.
- While property owners can take steps to deter cats from their yards, bear in mind you cannot, under law, do anything to harm the animal.

#### Please refrain from feeding stray dogs or cats!!

# EASY BRAZILIAN CHEESE BREAD

The recipe as presented is fairly basic. Feel free to dress it up a bit with herbs or spices of your choice.

#### INGREDIENTS:

- 1 large egg, room temperature
- 1/3 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 2/3 cup milk
- 1 1/2 cups (170 grams) tapioca flour
- 1/2 cup (packed, about 66 grams) grated cheese\*
  1 teaspoon salt (or more to taste)

### DIRECTIONS:

-Preheat oven to 400°F. Spread a small amount olive oil around the insides of each well of a <u>mini-muffin</u> tin.

-Blend ingredients: Put all of the ingredients into a blender and pulse until smooth. You may need to use a spatula to scrape down the sides of the blender so that everything gets blended well. At this point you can store the batter in the refrigerator for up to a week.

-Pour batter into prepared mini-muffin tin, not quite to the top; leave about 1/8 inch from the top.

-Bake at 400°F in the oven for 15-20 minutes, until all puffy and nicely browned. Remove from oven and let cool on a rack for a few minutes.

-Eat while warm or save to reheat later.

-Note that Brazilian cheese bread is very chewy, a lot like Japanese mochi.


\*We get good results with feta cheese (no need to grate), or fresh farmer's cheese. If using fresh farmer's cheese, you may want to add another 1/2 teaspoon of salt.
