RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Silver Collection at the door. Thank you for your donation.

2. All exhibits must be made by the exhibitor and be in their possession and must not have been entered in a previous Innisfree fair. Each exhibitor shall be able to enter only once in any class.

3. The Danish system of judging will be used by all judges. Ribbons for First, Second and Third in each class may be awarded. Exhibits will be awarded: First \$3.00, Second \$2.00 and Third \$1.00.

4. Judges reserve the sole right to judge and place exhibits as they see fit and if in the opinion of the judge, there is no exhibit in a class worthy of first prize, and none shall be given.

5. If, in any class, there are less than three entries, the board shall be at liberty to amalgamate such entries with another of like character.

6. Exhibitors are not required to be members of the society, although they are cordially invited to become members. Membership is \$2.00 per year.

7. The Fair Board will take every precaution to ensure the safety of the entries in the show but will not be responsible for any loss or damage.

8. The Fair Committee reserves the right to decide any point, which is not covered by the rules and regulations.

9. Each person will be able to obtain entry tags as they enter their exhibits. Please fill out the exhibitor's list at the back of the fair book.

10. Entries and entry tags will be accepted and completed at the Innisfree Rec. Centre. Tuesday, August 09, 2022, from 5:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m.

Doors will be locked at 8:00 p.m.

Judging on Tuesday, August 09, 2022.

11. Perishable items must be covered by a plastic bag. Do not cover vegetables.

12. Doors will be open to the public at 12:00 p.m., Wednesday, August 11.

13. The Fair Board will not be responsible for any accidents pertaining to fair activities. Exhibits must not be removed until 4:00 p.m. Wednesday, August 14. Building must be cleared by 4:30 p.m.

14. An exhibitor's fee of \$2.00 will be assessed to all exhibitors.
