Interesting facts about the dandelion flower

- -The dandelion is the only flower that represents the 3 celestial bodies of the sun, moon and stars. The yellow flower resembles the sun, the puff ball resembles the moon and the dispersing seeds resemble the stars.
- -The dandelion flower opens to greet the morning and closes in the evening to go to sleep.
- -Every part of the dandelion is useful: root, leaves, flower. It can be used for food, medicine and dye for coloring.
- -Up until the 1800s people would pull grass out of their lawns to make room for dandelions and other useful "weeds" like chickweed, malva, and chamomile.
- -The name dandelion is taken from the French word "dent de lion" meaning lion's tooth, referring to the coarsely-toothed leaves.
- -Dandelions have one of the longest flowering seasons of any plant.
- -Dandelion seeds are often transported away by a gust of wind and they travel like tiny parachutes. Seeds are often carried as many as 5 miles from their origin!
- -Animals such as birds, insects and butterflies consume nectar or seed of dandelion.
- -Dandelion flowers do not need to be pollinated to form seed.
- -Dandelion can be used in the production of wine and root beer. Root of dandelion can be used as a substitute for coffee.
- -Dandelions have sunk their roots deep into history. They were well known to ancient Egyptians, Greeks and Romans, and have been used in Chinese traditional medicine for over a thousand years.
- Dandelion is used in folk medicine to treat infections and liver disorders. Tea made of dandelion act as diuretic.
- -If you mow dandelions, they'll grow shorter stalks to spite you.
- -Dandelions are, quite possibly, the most successful plants that exist, masters of survival worldwide.
- -A not so fun fact: Every year countries spend millions on lawn pesticides to have uniform lawns of non-native grasses, and we use 30% of the country's water supply to keep them green.

The court revitalization project is seeing significant progress. On July 8 Spectre Systems started excavating the old surface and preparing a proper base to lay down the new asphalt. Once that was complete, Eagle Fencing drilled post holes for additional perimeter posts and interior cross fencing. They will return in August to put up the perimeter fence.

The next step will be having Tomko Sports Systems lay down the special coloured sport surfacing and mark out the lines for the pickleball and basketball courts. The cross fencing will then be installed along with the wind screen around the pickleball court.





Mayor and Council met on July 19th, 2022, for a Regular Council meeting.

Policies/Bylaws:

• Council approved amended Unsightly Premises Bylaw 676-22

New Business:

- Council endorsed a motion to proceed with a Water Meter Rehabilitation Project, estimated at \$47,000, to be funded in part by the Municipal Sustainability Program and Canada Community-Building Fund
- Council endorsed a motion to approve a NAS-based, 12-month, full disaster recovery back up system through VM System's pursuant to the Village of Innisfree Documents & Data Storage Policy 1200-02, to be funded by MSI Operating Grant.
- Council endorsed the transfer of ownership of the "Antique" 1954 Fire Truck to the County of Minburn, pursuant to the Regional Fire Services Agreement. Further, that the "Innisfree Fire Department" remain on the Antique Truck and the Village to be gifted the Antique Truck, should the County no longer need or want the vehicle.
- Council endorsed the renewal of the contract for audit services with Metrix Group LLP for 2022-2024.
- Council approved the 2nd Quarter Strategic Plan.
- Council appointed Mr. Jason Driscoll as a member of the Local Assessment Review Board and Composite Assessment Review Board for a three-year term (2022-2025) in accordance with the MGA and Village Regional Assessment Review Board Bylaw.
- Council approved the Power+ Agreement and Retail Service Agreement provided by Alberta Municipalities.
- Council approved the Next Generation 9-1-1 Local Government Service Agreement provided by Telus.
- The 2013 Can Am Commander 1000 tender submitted by Mr. Garry Gizowski for \$6,227.77 (GST Excluded) was approved.

- No Person shall occupy, suffer, or permit any other Person to occupy a Trailer, Holiday Trailer upon a Highway or Village-owned Property which has not been designated for Trailer or Holiday Trailer Parking unless for a special occasion and then <u>no</u> longer than 48 hours or a longer time is granted.
- Notwithstanding the provisions of 6.6, a Person may Park and occupy a Trailer or Holiday Trailer upon Village-Owned Property provided that written permission has been obtained from the CAO or their designate.
- An Owner or Operator of a Vehicle and attached Trailer or Holiday Trailer shall not park the Vehicle and attached Trailer or Holiday Trailer on a Highway or Roadway for more than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours

CANINE & FELINE CONTROL

The Village of Innisfree Administration would like to remind the public of the Canine Bylaw 601-15 & Feline Bylaw 607/15. Canine Bylaw 601-15 & Feline Bylaw 607/15. Canine Bylaw 601-15 & Feline Bylaw 607/15 clearly states that no owner shall allow their Dog(s) or cat(s) to run at large, at any time, without being leashed or harnessed while off the premises of its owner.

The Village of Innisfree would like to share, with its residents, simple steps to humanely deter unwanted cats from their yards and flower beds:

- Some plants and herbs naturally deter cats by giving off smells that cats dislike, including Rue, Lavender, Pennyroyal, Lemongrass, Coleus and Citronella.
 - Water is an effective repellent. Gently spraying or splashing water on a cat is a useful method for keeping them away. There are numerous types of cat repellent sprays and granules, which can be purchased at many hardware stores.
 - Remove any food sources that may be attracting cats into your yard. Ensure garbage / compost bins are securely shut. Bury chicken wire in the soil in the flower beds that you especially don't want cats to enter.
- While property owners can take steps to deter cats from their yards, bear in mind you cannot, under law, do anything to

EASY BATTER ROLLS

Ingredients:


- -3 cups all purpose flour
- -2 Tbsp sugar
- -1 pkg (1/4 oz) active dry yeast
- -1 tsp salt
- -1 cup water
- -1 Tbsp butter 1 large egg, room temp
- -Melted butter

Directions:

- -In a large bowl combine 2 cups of the flour, sugar, yeast and salt.
- -In a saucepan, heat water and butter to 120 to 130° F (really just warm). Add water to dry ingredients, beat until blended.
- -Add egg; beat on low speed for 30 seconds, then on high for 3 mins.
- -Stir in remaining flour(batter will be stiff). Do not
- -Cover and let rise in a warm place until doubled, about 30 mins.
- -Stir dough down. Fill 12 greased muffin cups about half full. -Cover and let rise until doubled, about 15 mins.
- -Bake at 350°F until golden brown, 15 20 mins. Cool for 1 min before removing from pan to a wire rack.
- -Brush tops with melted butter.

Note: These rolls are very dense and should be eaten the

day you make as they stale fast.


