

MATRIMONIAL CAKE

(Date Squares)

Preheat oven to 350°F (180°C)

INGREDIENTS FOR CRUMBLY MIXTURE

1 cup brown sugar

1 cup butter

1 tsp baking powder ¼ tsp salt

1 and ½ cups rolled oats

1 and ½ cups white flour

INGREDIENTS FOR

FILLING

1 pound of dates (pitted)

1 cup water

2 tbsp brown sugar

½ tsp baking soda

1 tsp lemon juice

DIRECTIONS FOR CRUMBLY MIXTURE:

Combine dry and add butter in and mix until crumbly. Press half of this crumbly mixture into a 9 inch baking pan

DIRECTIONS FOR FILLING:

- -In a pot combine dates, water, brown sugar and baking soda.
- -Bring to a boil and cook until thickened.
- -Stir in lemon juice and remove from heat.


DIRECTIONS TO ASSEMBLE:

- -Spread the cooked filling over the first crumbly base.
- -Spread the rest of the crumbly mixture over the top of the filling.
- -Bake 20 to 25 mins or until top is lightly toasted.
- -Cool before cutting into squares.

Congratulations to the winner of our Valentine's Day Basket, Edie Whitten! Thank you everyone for your continued support in helping us to provide programming to our community.





Wapasu Lake Conditions Petition

Residents of Innisfree, Lavoy, Ranfurly, Vegreville, and other communities throughout the County of Minburn have long made the trip to Wapasu Lake to spend sunny summer days basking in the sunshine and swimming in the sandy, shallow waters. Located 4km south of the Yellowhead, Wapasu is the only spring fed, freshwater lake along the highway from Lloydminster to Edmonton. The lake is home to many cabins, a bed and breakfast, and a day use area for the public. The day use area includes firepits with complementary wood, a cook house, playground, showers, and a sandy beach for users to enjoy.

The lake is also a part of the Wapasu Lake Conservation Park which serves as a migration stop of thousands of birds. The name Wapasu comes from the Cree word for white swan, a bird that frequents the area. The park is a bird watchers dream, along with various other wildlife found in the parks trail system.

As with most Alberta lakes, Wapasu has been hit hard by a heavy cyanobacteria problem, commonly known as blue-green algae. Over the past two to three years the problem has been made worse due to receding water levels caused by drought conditions. Swimming guidelines and warnings have been posted at the lake to warn of the hazards of blue-green algae.

Blue-green Algae is commonly known for being deadly for pets, but humans can be affected as well. Different species of the algae can produce toxins that can damage the liver (hepatotoxins), affect the central nervous system (neurotoxins) and produce toxic alkaloids that affect the renal system and gastrointestinal tract.

In the spring of 2022, the County of Minburn hired a firm to review the condition of Wapasu and to provide suggestions for the remediation of the lake on the prevention of blue-green algae. The findings suggested a couple of options for improving the overall health of the lake including the installation of an aeration system or the application of an alum treatment. The full report is available on the County of Minburn's website under the 'Local Notices' section.

After review, the County council has decided to not move forward with any of the recommendations, citing costs as a concern. The lake is being left to nature to deal with the issue.

In February of 2023, an online petition was started by cabin residents of Wapasu Lake to have the County take a second look at the proposal or to investigate alternate options to deal with the algae problem. The petition hopes to gain signatures from both locals and residents from all over the County to support the health of the lake so that it can be enjoyed by all users, human and animal alike. **The petition can be found by visiting 'petitions.net/wapasu'**.




