

#### **BEAN SALAD**

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

-1 can cut green beans

-1 can cut wax (yellow)

beans

-1 can red kidney beans

-1 can six bean medley

-1 can (227ml) sliced
water chestnuts
(chopped into 3's)
-1 red onion sliced thinly
-Sliced red, yellow or green
pepper (or all 3)

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

-Open and drain all cans and combine in a large bowl that has a good fitting lid. Add sliced red onion.

#### DRESSING:

In another bowl combine: ½ C white vinegar ½ C canola oil ½ C brown sugar

1 tsp celery seed

Salt and Pepper (approx ½ tsp each)

Combine well and pour over beans.


-Put lid on bean bowl and put in fridge. Everytime you think of it turn that bowl upside down and back again. Keep those beans dressed.


# Author with local connection visits Delnorte School!





## Waterlines - Notice to residents

As everyone is aware, there have been issues with water breaks this past winter/spring – both at Christmas and Easter. Council and administration wanted to update the residents as to what is happening to resolve these issues.

Some of the issues with the waterlines and the shut off valves have already been addressed in the past few months. The 2016 Innisfree Infrastructure Plan was reviewed by Administration. The Village of Innisfree hired Bar Engineering this winter after sending out requests for proposals. Bar Engineering and Administration worked together to identify the priority projects.

The 3 projects identified to be done in the next few years were:

- Priority 1 The north-end water looping,
- Priority 2 The south-end water looping, and
- Priority 3 The 50<sup>th</sup> street road on the east side of the railroad tracks going to Seed Cleaning Plant.

## However, the priorities have changed somewhat due to the two water breaks we had.

## The northwest water break at Christmas – This is now Priority 2

- Grant applications for the north-end water looping were already sent in this winter for use of funding from grant monies we already received in previous years but had not spent yet.
- The engineers are working on the tender documents to loop the waterline from the 54 Street/51 Avenue area and across the railroad tracks.
- Other work being done at the same time involve a new Fire Hydrant, a manhole, sidewalks, some sanitary lines and the road.
- The surveyors have already been out.
- The geotechnical team have already been out.
- Project should be completed either this fall or next summer depending on CN approval and contractor availability.

## The 50<sup>th</sup> street water break at Easter – This is now Priority 1

- This project was previously priority 4 but has now been changed to Priority 1
- The waterlines are 4 inch cast iron and will be replaced with 6 inch.
- The problem shut off value at the top of the hill will definitely be repaired this summer as this was the reason the complete Village had to be shut off and not just one area.
- The geotechnical team have already checked out the road to see whether it needs to be done at the same time as the waterlines. If not, just waterlines will be done along with the necessary road repair. Geotechnical report for this project is expected within a few weeks.
- Council has approved this project during our Strategic Planning session and the grant application will be sent in to the Province within the next few days.
- There is already grant funding available, we just need approval from the Province to spend the money.
- Project should be completed this summer.

Administration and Public Works will also be checking and repairing as necessary all other shut off valves in the Village. There is also a second fire hydrant being installed this summer at the intersection of Hwy 870 and 49 Avenue. All materials were purchased in 2022 but we were not able to get a contractor before year end.

Council and administration are doing their best to address infrastructure issues and we hope this update answers some of your concerns.


