## 1. Call to Order

- 2. Personnel Closed Session Pursuant to FOIPP Act Sections 17 & 40
  - a. *FOIPP Act, Section 40*: Section 40 of Alberta's Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIP Act) outlines the circumstances under which a public body may disclose personal information, providing legal authority for such disclosures.
    - i. Here's a breakdown of key aspects of Section 40:
    - ii. General Authority for Disclosure:
    - iii. Section 40(1) identifies specific circumstances where a public body can disclose personal information.
    - iv. Examples of Circumstances:
    - v. Consent: A public body can disclose personal information with the individual's consent.
    - vi. Not Contrary to Public Interest: Disclosure may be permissible if it's not an unreasonable invasion of privacy and is not contrary to the public interest.
    - vii. Enforcing Legal Rights: Disclosure is allowed for enforcing legal rights of the Government of Alberta or a public body.
    - viii. Collective Agreement: Disclosing information to comply with the terms of a collective agreement.
    - ix. Averting Harm: Disclosure is permitted if it averts or minimizes a risk of harm to the health or safety of a minor.
  - b. *FOIPP Act, Section 17*: Alberta's Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIP Act), Section 17 requires a public body to refuse disclosure of personal information if it would be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's privacy, unless exceptions apply.
